

NJ Child Care Facilities Improvement Program - Phase 1

Eligible Facility Improvement Project Idea Board

The New Jersey Child Care Facilities Improvement Program provides grants to child care providers for facilities improvements that will contribute to high quality early childhood learning environments. Phase 1 of the grant program will cover projects between \$50,000 and \$200,000 for specific interior and exterior improvements to licensed child care centers. The purpose of this "Idea Board" is to assist child care providers to make decisions about proposed facility improvement projects so they are aligned to the grant's eligible uses, particularly those who are unsure of how to get started with your planning or are looking for help developing an improvement plan prior to speaking to a New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development (NJDOL) Public Works Registered Contractor. Use this resource to observe and document the needs of your facility by reviewing the **Project Prompt Questions** and use the **Notes** section to write down ideas and questions.

Some high-level questions to consider are:

- Were any violations identified during your last licensing inspection? Do you have any open or active violations?**
- What needs or areas for improvement were identified in any formal assessments like your last licensing report, Environmental Rating Scale (ECERS-3, FCCERS-3 or ITERS-3) results, and/or Grow NJ Kids assessment? Use these to help guide your decision-making process.
- What ongoing health & safety issues does your facility face?
- What security issues does your facility face?
- What are the opportunities to upgrade systems and address energy efficiency?

**You are strongly encouraged to prioritize and propose improvements that address any issues cited by the NJ Department of Children and Families (NJDCF) Office of Licensing (OOL), especially those that have been outstanding for more than 12 months. We recognize that funding for facility improvements is not typically available to child care providers, but access to the grant can help address those concerns and violations making your environment healthy and safe for the children in your care.

The questions below are not inclusive of all the different work or improvements that could be completed, so working with a New Jersey Registered Public Works Contractor will be a vital step in your planning process. You can consider using the information collected here to guide conversations with your Public Works Contractor to help make final decisions about your proposed project.

<u>Remember</u> that these contractors are not used to defining the scope of a project quotes – usually they are bidding on a project proposed by local or state government without any input on what the project is. Having some ideas for them as to what you'd like to accomplish will make it much easier to navigate the conversation.

NEW CLASSROOM Reminder: Expansion of the facility to build additional space is not an eligible project for this grant, but renovating an existing space is an eligible project. **Project Prompt Notes** Do you have unused space in your facility to create a new classroom? Do you have an empty classroom you'd like to renovate? Would this new classroom need any demolition? Breaking down walls? Removing old built-ins or equipment? Removing old bathroom fixtures? Pulling up old carpet or flooring?

EXISTING CLASSROOMS AND BATHROOMS

Reminder: Grant funding CAN NOT be used to supplant or replace existing space dedicated to infant and toddlers (in other words, you can't convert an infant or toddler classroom into a preschool classroom with these grant funds)

Would the existing classroom need repair, replacement or installation of thing like: Child height sinks? A diaper changing area? ADA compliant doorway or other egresses (entrances/exits)? Partition installation or creating a wall? Painting? Lighting? Windows? Adding more natural light? Built in or mounted shelving? Flooring? Soundproofing? Leaking pipes or drainage issues? Window treatments like blinds or shades? Adding storage/closet space for materials, cots/nap mats? New children's furniture like cubbies, tables, chairs, free standing shelving, book cases, etc.? Reminder: These costs are limited to 20% of your total project costs. The primary goal of the grant is to pay for facility improvements. Eligible costs are limited to the categories listed below.
