

# What is the New Jersey Child Care Facilities Improvement Program?

The Child Care Facilities Improvement Program was funded by the Child Care Revitalization Fund, allocating \$100M of federal American Rescue Plan funds, including \$54.5 million for NJEDA to provide facility improvement grants and technical assistance to child care providers. Legislation was passed by the New Jersey State Legislature and signed into law by Governor Murphy in June 2021. Funding for Phase 1 of the Child Care Facilities Improvement Pilot Program will be supported through the ARP funding, as well as an additional \$4.45 million in state funding.



Provides grants to New Jersey child care providers for facilities improvements that will contribute to high quality early childhood learning environments.



NJEDA has over **\$90M** to support child care facility improvements Phase 1 of the Child Care Facilities Improvement Plan will be up to **\$25M** 



### What is considered a project?

What is a project? All construction, all labor, all Furniture, Fixtures & Equipment and all soft costs at one location



### What is an **eligible use**? All the activities making up the project.

For example: Happy Kids Child Care center would like to

- 1. replace all the windows
- 2. paint all their classrooms
- 3. replace the flooring
- 4. install a shed for their outdoor toys and materials.





### **Eligible Interior Facility Improvements**



Create **additional classroom space** in existing location by converting or adapting other rooms to classroom space

Create or improve areas to serve as indoor gross motor and/or multi-purpose space

Improve **egress and access** within the facility, as well as egress and access to the outdoors for children with no or limited mobility





### Install, repair, and/or improve:

- Bathrooms with age-appropriate plumbing and child height fixtures that are in or adjacent to classrooms
- Child height handwashing sinks in classrooms
- Electric and lighting systems
- Plumbing (e.g., leaking pipes, drainage issues)
- Diaper changing areas
- Nurse area, sick child area
- Windows in classrooms and common areas
- ► Flooring
- ► Fire safety and fire protection systems
- Indoor air quality systems
- Doors, entrances and exits including locking mechanisms
- Remediation of environmental issues
- Security systems including security cameras
- Kitchens and food preparation areas
- Acoustics
- Secure storage areas
- Stable partitions and/or floor-to-ceiling walls to separate classrooms and improve acoustics
- Furniture, fixtures, and equipment



## **Eligible Exterior Facility Improvements**

Install, repair, replace and/or improve equipment to provide children with age-appropriate, safe, engaging **outdoor play areas**:

- Climbing structures (e.g., adding more cushioning)
- Creating a separate space for infants
- Bollards for parking lots and/or playgrounds
- Covered enclosures, shade structures, awnings, outdoor furniture, storage shed

Install, repair, and/or improve:

- Exterior fencing, including security gates
- Roofing
- Decking
- Sidewalks connecting classrooms
- Parking areas



Increase **accessibility** or meet code enforcement requirements (e.g. installing or replacing ramps)



Address exterior drainage issues





# **Eligible Costs**

- You do not have to apply for all three types of eligible costs
- You could apply for: hard costs only; hard costs and FFE only; hard costs and soft costs only; or all three
- You cannot apply *only* for soft costs since they are capped at 20% of the total grant
- You are encouraged to consider several factors when deciding whether to include FFE costs through this funding



### **Hard Costs**

- Interior and Exterior Eligible Projects
- Paid directly to Public
  Works Registered
  Contractor



Soft Costs

- Architect fees
- Permit fees
- Construction management
- Freight and shipping delivery
- Environmental assessment



### Furniture, Fixtures and Equipment (FFE)

- Defined as moveable items used in normal, everyday operation, excluding consumable materials.
- Reimbursed to child care providers (they have to pay for it first and we pay them back)



### **Phase 1 Project Requirements**

### Improvement projects must be between \$50,000 - \$200,000

- Prospective costs only
- Grant must cover the full cost
  of the proposed facility
  improvement
- Up to 20% of total costs can be used for soft costs
- All eligible uses outlined in a project on the application must be for a single location
- All work is subject to prevailing wage and affirmative action requirements

- Project should begin within 1 year of receiving the grant award and completed within 1 year of the start of construction
- All quotes and work must be completed by a NJ Public Works Contractor registered with the NJ Department of Labor and Workforce Development



- Projects less than \$50,000
- 8 No retrospective costs or reimbursement
- May not combine this grant with other funding to cover project costs
- Projects cannot replace existing infant/toddler space and therefore reduce the overall number of infants and toddlers served at the facility



# **Affirmative Action (AA) Reporting**



AA applies when the company has a total workforce of *four (4) or more employees* (for the entire company).



For those contracts where AA applies, The AA Plan (AA Form 1) is due prior to start of construction.

### Good Faith Efforts:

It is based on "goals" and "timetables"– of how many of each protected group the employer hopes to add in a given period of time. The failure to reach a goal will not necessarily be considered evidence of discrimination if the contractor can show "good faith" efforts to reach the goal. Examples of "good faith" are:

- Referral Letters
- Advertisements in local news papers
- Outreach to unions and NJDOL One-Stop programs

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# **Prevailing Wage**

The Prevailing Wage Rate Determinations list wage and fringe benefit rates based on collective bargaining agreements established for a particular craft or trade on the locality in which the public work is performed. In New Jersey, rates vary by county and statewide and by the type of work performed.



Applicable prevailing wage rates are those wages and fringe benefits in effect on the date the contract is awarded. All pre-determined rate increases listed **at the time the contract is awarded** must also be paid, beginning on the dates specified.

The rates and increases listed in the determinations are the *only* rates that can be used for the project and are valid for 24 months.

Nothing prohibits the payment of more than the prevailing wage rate to **any** workman employed on the construction project.

Certified payroll records must be submitted to the public body (the EDA), by all contractors and subcontractors, for each employee on the project *within ten (10) days of the payment of wages*.



### N.J.A.C. 3A:52

The Manual of Requirements is promulgated pursuant to the Child Care Center Licensing Act, N.J.S.A. 30:5B-1 *et. Seq.* 





### ELIGIBILITY

The NJ Department of Children and Families (DCF), Office of Licensing (OOL), Child Care Licensing (CCL) is authorized to:

- license child care centers caring for 6 or more children under 13 years of age for less than 24 hours a day.
- examine the physical plant or facilities, including but not limited to, storage areas and additional floor levels without a delay or an escort.

### Child care centers licensed by CCL as of June 4, 2021 are eligible for the New Jersey Child Care Facilities Improvement Program

### PHYSICAL FACILITY REQUIREMENTS

Compliance with all applicable provisions of:

- 3A:52, Subchapter 5. Physical Facility Requirements
- New Jersey Uniform Construction Code (NJUCC), as Specified in N.J.A.C. 5:23
  - E-Use to I-4 Changes Require:
    - Architectural Plans Submitted to Municipality and the OOL.
    - Municipality and OOL Approval Prior to Construction
- Playground Safety Subcode for Equipment, Layout, Surfacing, etc.
- Manufacturer Instructions for Furniture, Equipment, and Supplies

### **ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS**

### OUTDOOR

- Remediation Action Outcome (RAO) Letter Completed by an NJDEP-Certified LSRP
- Remediation, if Applicable, Conducted by NJDEP-Certified Environmentalists

### INTERIOR/STRUCTURAL

- NJDOH Safe Building Interior Certificate (SBIC); Indoor Health Assessment and Vapor intrusion Remediation, if Applicable
- Water Testing Conducted by an NJDEP-Certified Lab (Repeated Post-Remediation, if Applicable)
- Lead Paint Testing and/or Remediation Conducted by NJDEP-Certified Lead Paint Evaluators and Contractors

### HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELL-BEING

Work must not compromise the health, safety, and well-being of the children in care.

- Major Projects will need to be completed after operating hours.
- Fire protective systems, water, plumbing, electric and gas must be fully functioning and operational at all times during operating hours.
- Construction equipment and tools must be inaccessible to children at all times.
- Exits and egresses cannot be blocked or limited at any time.


