Information on identifying a potential brownfield site

The Brownfield Redevelopment Incentive Program (BRIP) defines a brownfield as "any former or current commercial or industrial site that is currently vacant or under-utilized and on which there has been, or there is suspected to have been, a discharge of a contaminant, or on which there is contaminated building material."
