On November 12, 2025, the NJEDA board approved the first set of grantees through the \$30 million Food Equity and Economic Development (FEED) NJ program. These first set of 50 organizations were approved for a total of \$20.6 million in grant awards.

NJEDA is still reviewing applications and additional approvals will be made at a later date. NJEDA expects to approve an additional 20 to 25 awards, bringing the total number of awards to 70 to 75 grants made within the \$30 million FEED NJ program.

Listed in alphabetical order, the following 50 applicants were approved for grant awards at the November 12 board meeting. The details below include the approved grant amount, the New Jersey Food Desert Communities (FDCs) they propose to serve, and a brief summary of their project.
